Family: Passifloraceae

Common Name: Passionflower

- Height: 10-12'
- Spread: 3-5'
- Light requirements: Full Sun to Part Shade
- Soil: occasionally wet; pH is Acidic, Neutral, Alkaline; well drained; loam, sand, clay soil type
- Flower color: Scarlet Red to Deep Red
- Growth: Vine
- Native Origin: South America
- Good alternative to invasive Chinese Wisteria
- Interesting Facts: Passion flowers have an acquired religious significance that dates back to the 1700s. Butterflies and Hummingbirds are attracted to the Passionflower.
